

Wildflower seed types

The majority of our products including *Little Bloomers*, *Deco Bloomers* and *Pop-up Hearts* contain a wild flower seed mix. This seed selection has been selected for ease of growing and variety of flower types. Details of the seed types are given below:



Drummond Phlox

Phlox drummondii

This short, hardy, annual, native to Texas has been used extensively in European gardens for decades and has exquisite deep red flowers.



Wallflower

Erysimum

Wallflowers are native to Europe, Asia and Northern America. They are small, annual, short-lived perennial herbs or sub-shrubs.



Candy tuft

Iberis

Native to Europe, where it is often found growing wild in grain fields. It is a hardy, fast-growing annual with lance shaped green leaves



Moss Verbena

Verbena tenuisecta

A great container plant, verbena is a fragrant trailing annual that blooms through winter's first frost. Origin: South America.



Scarlet Sage

Salvia splendens

A scarlet sage native to Brazil, now widely grown as an ornamental garden plant. It is a sub-shrub or herbaceous perennial plant growing to 1 m tall.



Lemon Mint

Monarda citriodora

A very hardy annual herb, it has deep purple to lavender blooms and its leaves have a distinctive lemon scent.



Sweet William

Dianthus Barbatus

Sweet William is a traditional English garden plant, native to the mountains of southern Europe. The flowers are produced in a dense cluster of up to 30 at the top of the stems and have a spicy, clove-like scent.



Black-Eyed Susan

Thunbergia alata

A herbaceous perennial climbing plant, native to Eastern Africa, which has been naturalized in other parts of the world. It produces decorative triangular leaves and large, yellow to orange flowers with black centres.

Shasta Daisy
Chrysanthemum Maximum
Native to Europe, Shasta Daisy is a hardy perennial. The white petalled flowers with golden yellow centers are borne individually on single stems and can be as large as 6 inches across.



Sweet Alyssum
Lobularia maritima
Native to the Mediterranean region and Macaronesia, now widely naturalised throughout the temperate regions of the world. It produces masses of crisp white blooms, sometimes with a rose or violet blush.



Toadflax
Linaria vulgaris
Native to most of Europe, toad flax produces tiny, delicate flowers with long spurs. Flowers come in a multitude of colors ranging from yellow, red and pink to white or purple.



Plains Coreopsis
Coreopsis tinctorias
Native to the great plains of the USA and now widely used for landscape gardens. It has brilliant yellow flowers with dark red or brown centres of various sizes.

Spruce tree seeds

Our *Pop-up Bloomers* Christmas decorations are embedded with a type of spruce tree seed:



Wilson's spruce
Picea wilsonii
A pyramidal form, narrow leaved evergreen tree. A relatively small type of spruce it has silvery new shoots and bright green needles. Can grow up to a height of 65 feet with a spread of 15 feet.
